

PUBLIC NOTICE
IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER
Monitoring and Reporting Requirements Not Met for

Moongate Water

Your water is safe to drink this is due to a lack of communication with NMED.

Este informe contiene información importante acerca de su agua potable. Haga que alguien lo traduzca para usted, o hable con alguien que lo entienda.

Our water system recently violated a drinking water requirement. Although this is not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened, what we are doing to correct this situation.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During the 2025 monitoring period we did not monitor or did not complete all monitoring requirements for lead and copper in tap water and, therefore, cannot be sure of the quality of your drinking water during that time.

What should you do?

There is nothing you need to do at this time.

What happened?

The New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) files with the EPA for waivers and variances for Lead and Copper testing, these tests are collected through the utilities and paid for through NMED. Moongate was never notified of the testing schedule or authorized to collect and deliver Lead and Copper samples to the lab until there was a violation issued.

What is being done?

Moongate through our participating customers collected 40 lead and copper samples and submitted these samples to the Hall lab in Albuquerque on 4-17-2026.

The Lead testing resulted with 36 of samples had no lead detected and 4 samples range from 0.0005 to 0.0047 mg/L which is below the lead action level of 0.015 mg/L

The Copper testing results range from .0042 to .0087 mg/L which is below the copper action level of 1.3 mg/L.
